## LYNDOCH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The next meeting of the Lyndoch Historical Society will be held on Sunday 7th February at 2.00 p.m. in the meeting room at the rear of the Lyndoch Library.

There will be dual topics for the occasion, the first being the 175th Anniversary of a group of Lutherans from Posen boarding the 476 ton ship, "Heloise", under Captain Beckmann. They set sail from the Port of Bremen on 12th October 1846 to commence a journey to South Australia in the hope of a better life. The ship had 5 passengers in the cabin; and in the steerage 214. These passengers included 40 farmers, 14 miners, 1 cloth weaver and a gold and silver smith. It meant a voyage of 5 months spent in cramped conditions that lacked privacy while many endured rough weather, sea sickness, and illness.

Among the passengers were a group of families from Posen, who elected to remain together upon arrival in Pt Adelaide and went on to settle in the village of Hoffnungsthal, Valley of Hope, on Sections 567 (Giles Vale) and 568 (McLaren Vale) in the Hundred of Barossa. The families were Hausler, Huf, Krieg, Leske, Menzel, J. Mibus, G. Mibus, Noske, Nuske, and Semmler.

Descendants of the Noske family, grandchildren Dolly Maddox, Ruth Reed, Lorraine Moore, Max Noske and great grandchildren Glenda Miegel, Elva Burke, Kath Zakis, Margaret Sloan and Tim Noske together with the Lyndoch Historical Society have combined to commemorate the occasion

The second topic will be a power point display of the 70th Anniversary of the Jubilee of Federation. Numerous events took place in Lyndoch over the year of 1951 with the highlight being winning the town float in the Vintage Festival and receiving the Jubilee Cup which is on display in the Society's museum.

## Council launches Community Connector to improve mental health

The Barossa Council is pleased to be launching the Barossa Community Connector pilot project which seeks to unlock the power and potential of the local community.

The project will implement an evidence based approach to build on the strengths of individuals, communities and services to improve connection and build a holistic 'good life'.

"We know there can sometimes be a reluctance to seek mental health support and that often people can find it hard to know where to look when they do decide to seek help.

Our Community Connector will work with individuals to build resilience and reduce isolation, which will ultimately reduce the need for crisis support through early and informal intervention," said Mayor Lange.

Through a successful Our Town Support Fund grant of \$50,000 plus additional Council funding of \$31,662 and in-kind contributions of \$17,200, the pilot project is funded to operate until 30 June 2021, with scope to grow beyond this timeframe.

The pilot project is overseen by a Project Team comprised of

residents and service providers and will be facilitated by a part-time Community Connector. It is available to residents 18 years and over who live, work or access services in Angaston, Lyndoch or Tanunda. No referral is necessary.

Community Connector, Tam Clarence, an experienced Social Worker, will work with individuals via the project to:

- *Identify their strengths, skills and goals*
- *Build their local networks*
- *Find practical solutions to issues*
- *Connect with local services and supports*
- *Access information and advice*
- *Build their social capacity and connection with social groups*

"Rather than waiting for a crisis to occur the Community Connector will help people to connect with the good things going on in the community, build relationships, take practical action and find natural support within the community," said Mayor Lange.

## Community Connector Information for Service Providers

In your role, from time-to-time, you are likely to come across clients / patients / friends or family who may need a little extra support to address some challenges in their lives. They aren't at crisis point, but they might be if they don't get some help.

You are invited to refer anyone who is eligible and who you think would benefit from engaging with the Barossa 'Community Connector'.

As a local person our Community Connector will work alongside residents to become connected with their local community and find practical ways to help. The program aims to support residents to improve their social, emotional and mental well-being and to feel a sense of belonging in their community.

The Community Connector will encourage residents to:

- Identify strengths, skills and goals
- Build local networks
- Find practical solutions to issues
- Connect with local services and supports
- Access information and advice
- Build social capacity and connection with social groups

## Who can access the project?

This pilot program is available to residents age 18 years and over who live, work or access services in the townships of Angaston, Lyndoch and Tanunda. No formal referral is necessary. The Community Connector project does not provide crisis support or case management. The pilot project is funded to run until 30 June 2021. We will provide an update about the future of the project beyond that.

The Barossa Council has reshaped its **2021 Australia Day** celebrations with a scaled-down event to celebrate the winners of the Citizen of the Year Awards.

In response to Covid-19 Council will not host its free Australia Day community breakfast, but will go ahead with its annual Citizenship and Citizen of the Year ceremonies at Tanunda Show Hall.

Guests at the January 26 event will be restricted to immediate family and friends of the winners and new citizens to ensure physical distancing and food service requirements can be met.

# Eric Walton, a Landcare Warrior

It is with great regret that the Williamstown & Lyndoch Landcare Group farewells Eric Walton a respected and cherished true landcare warrior.

Eric & his wife Noreen joined the Williamstown & Lyndoch Landcare Group in 1998 after the purchase of Altona CSR Landcare Reserve.

In 1998 the group were able to negotiate with the owners -CSR- to purchase the former sand quarry in Altona with funds raised from various sources. They passed the ownership to The Barossa Council with an agreement to develop and maintain what was to become known as the Altona CSR Landcare Reserve

Eric has been heavily involved in Williamstown & Lyndoch Landcare activities over many years includ-

ing an extended period as Vice Chairman of the management committee.

Eric was a key participant in the early years of the reserve revegetation project helping to build walking trails, lookouts and seats. Revegetation was undertaken using local seed base. Removal of old car bodies, pump houses, piping, rubbish and old fencing was also completed. The Barossa Council helped to build the entrance and the main tracks were upgraded and bought to a standard suitable for emergency services.

Publicity and promotion of the Altona CSR Landcare Reserve is an important part of group activities and Eric was known for his dedication to the promotion of the reserve. Included below is a picture of Eric giving one of his many talks to organisations.
